<u>Blacktown Rehabilitation After Care Service</u> (BRACS)

In 2002, God placed a burden on Captain Gary Martin's heart. He could see the needs of those leaving the William Booth rehab were struggling with. The people at WBH work with many who come from desperate circumstances; in an effort to be set free from their addictions. And the success rate is very good. **BUT**; here was Gary's burden. People who had often lost all connection with loved ones, and friends, or perhaps burned all their bridges, were leaving that sanctuary only to come back to the places where their problems began. This transition from a warm safe, loving environment back into the cold, stark loneliness of having to fend for themselves, with few life skills, was often too much, and they would return to what they knew – oblivion.

So Gary, assisted by our bandmaster Doug, and Major Ken Sans

got together and came up with a seed grant to start some sort of support program for these people.

The service began in early 2003, when Bob Rogan was employed to get the service up and running. At that time BRACS supplied supported accommodation, and personalized case management to graduates. It wasn't long before desperate people from the community were also included.

It's funny how things work out. Two of the early participants (who were using amphetamines) began singing the "I only smoke dope" song so Bob decided to try and help them beat their so-called dependence on cannabis. In 2003, there was no support for suffers of marijuana addiction anywhere in the western suburbs.

Undeterred Bob established a marijuana cessation program called "Beat the Bong", a five-week educational program to help participants deal with the detoxification process and life skills to help to live without it. That program became so successful that a twelve-step support group was setup that still continues, twice weekly. By the way, the denial of those two participants helped many others get well.

Along the way, BRACS became a provider of The Salvation Army's "Positive Lifestyle Program" for those leaving incarceration or awaiting trial, and still liaises with the courts across Sydney and the local Probation and Parole.

Bob has always envisioned an out-patients service for recovering alcoholics and addicts in this area, and is currently studying to achieve the credentials to establish this. There are so many in our area who have no opportunity to even go to a short term rehab let alone the ten months needed for William Booth House.

Currently BRACs also provides a Christian Counselling Service for anyone suffering from grief, depression, anxiety, post-traumatic stress disorder, and couple and family therapy.

In conjunction, BRACS facilitates Careforce programs such as building Self-worth, Man to Man, Women to Woman, Intimacy, Marriage Enrichment, Sexual Abuse, Recovery from divorce, and facilitator training for those programs. The "Laugh your way to a better marriage" program is often used because it uses humor to deal with the difficult situations arising within dysfunctional relationships. In addition, there is help for porn and sexual addiction problems, codependency, and gambling dependency.

A recovery-based church service was held every Sunday night for over seven years, and BRACS still has the capacity to run this whenever the need arises.

BRACS is also an entry point for the renowned best-practice Salvation Army Recovery centers across NSW.

At this point, I would like to ask from you folk who worship God and soldier here at Blacktown is for your prayer support. Currently, I have seven or eight people who come for regular counselling. Some of these folk are experiencing situations in their life that are almost unimaginable to most of us. People suffering from complicated post traumatic stress disorder; severe child sexual abuse within their family of origin, and incest, to name a few. Because of the confidentiality laws I am hindered in saying too much but God knows who they are. Perhaps I might be able to explain and ask for prayer through our newsletter on a regular basis, because in every case, Satan is doing his best to destroy lives. It's not that he wants them; he just doesn't want God to have them.
