Our Christmas Day Offering Kolanya Ambulance Project

This Christmas our offering will be given to purchase an Ambulance for the Salvation Army Kolanya Health Centre. You can give by cash and also through your credit card—forms and envelopes are available in the foyer today and on Christmas Day, this is a non-taxable deduction project.

Where is the Kenya West Territory

The African country of Kenya lies on the equator. Its capital, Nairobi, is home to four million people. The Salvation Army has been working in Kenya since 1921. In 2008, Kenya was divided into two Salvation Army territories — Kenya West and Kenya East. Kenya West lies west of the Great Rift Valley and borders Uganda. Today, the territory has 528 corps and 908 outposts, 127,789 Senior Soldiers, 123,152 Junior Soldiers, 891 schools and 16 clinics.

Where & What are we doing there?

Kolanya is a small community out towards the border with Uganda. Operating since the 1920s, Kolanya is a bustling Salvation Army complex. It contains four schools educating 4000 students, most of whom are boarders with a few local day pupils, in addition to its health centre.

Who does the Kolanya Health Centre look after?

The Army has been providing medical and health support to local people, particularly women and children, for so many decades that it is now a focal point in the community. The centre provides pre and post natal care, education for new mothers about nutrition and preventing disease and runs mobile medical clinics. The health centre is modestly sized and sparsely equipped, but its excellence has led to many people seeking treatment there, as the nearest referral hospital is over 30 km away.









Why does the Kolanya Health Centre need an ambulance?

As the centre has grown in reputation, the need for an ambulance has grown along with it: the centre's popularity has overwhelmed its capacity. To put it plainly, without an ambulance, people may die. There isn't currently the ability to transport patients to Kolanya from their homes or transport them to the closest hospital in time for life-saving treatment of urgent cases. Mothers and children, and the elderly, are particularly vulnerable with the hospital at least two hours drive away.

The centre is looking at a 2017 Toyota Landcruiser or similar kitted out with a stretcher, a bench seat plus lockers for storing medical equipment.


