On 2 September 2015, 3-year-old Syrian boy Alan Kurdi drowned in the Mediterranean Sea while trying to get to Canada with his family. The crisis that had been going for a number of years, suddenly had 'a face', the face of a child. The refugee crisis still continues today. It's not just something we see on our TV screens or read about in news stories, it is a global crisis that has reached our shores too.

As Christians what should our response be to the refugee crisis? We have a choice to make. We can either switch off, leaving it to someone else to deal with, believing there's nothing we can, or should do. Or we can choose to engage! Self-Denial is a call to engage to engage our finances, yes, but also our hearts and our actions. Jesus fought for the marginalised. He fought for the sinners, the outcasts, the foreigners. God raised up The Salvation Army to fight for the marginalised too. Our mandate is to the last, the lost, and the least.

Jesus answered, "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul and mind.' This is the first and most important command. And the second command is like the first: 'Love your neighbor as you love yourself. 'Mark 12: 30-31
