This Sunday is our Altar Service for the Self Denial Appeal. In Scripture an altar always represented a place of consecration and encounter with God. It's a place where a person consecrates himself or herself to God.

The physical act of placing your envelope on the altar represents your desire to in effect lay your life on the altar. It is an act of surrendering our lives again to the control of the Holy Spirit.
