Today's Old Testament reading from the *Common Lectionary* marks a shift in the semicontinuous reading of the Pentateuch, as the focus nows shifts to Moses. This text sets the scene for the Exodus by characterising the Egyptian oppression of the Israelite people and reporting the birth of Moses. The Psalm is a corporate thanksgiving song, an appropriate response to the anticipated deliverance from Egypt.

The epistolary lesson from Romans aims to exhort, drawing on the opening section that calls for us to offer ourselves as renewed, transformed beings in the sacrificial offering to God. In the Gospel reading, Matthew reports on his version of the episode at Caesarea Philippi in which he includes Jesus' comments on Peter as the rock upon which he will establish the church.
