Location	Kenya East and Mozambique
Amount	\$10,000
Description	<p>Salvation Army children's centres and crèches offer a caring environment for children from vulnerable families.</p> <p>A great majority of the children that attend centres are orphans or have a single mother without an income. Given this scenario, children centres struggle greatly to cover their running expenses with the school fees.</p> <p>With so many other priorities such as food and utilities to keep the centres running, educational materials and toys get at the bottom of the list.</p> <p>Knowing how important play is to the development of a child, a playground will bring the below centres to life!</p>

Project 2: Rehabilitation aids for Joy town school for the disabled

Location	Kenya East
Amount	\$10,000
Description	<p>Joy town boarding school is a place of hope for disabled children and their families.</p> <p>There are all kinds of disabilities at this school, from physical to mental and combination of both in some children.</p> <p>Currently they face many challenges, but possibly, one of the biggest is the lack of funds to provide all children with the appropriate rehabilitation aids for their disability.</p> <p>Their strategy is to share what's available among the children, so a wheel chair gets used by a different child one week at a time.</p> <p>Your financial support to Joy town will allow them to fix the aids that are broken in the workshop, and to buy new ones.</p>

Joy town workshop – School for the disabled, Kenya East

Project 3: Equipment for a vocational training centre

Location	Kenya East
Amount	\$10,000
Description	<p>Vocational training centres play an important role in developing communities; they offer practical and vocational education to young people who can't afford high school or tertiary studies and who are in need of an income generating skill.</p> <p>Variety village takes children who have gone through other Salvation Army schools including Joy Town. There is a high population of disabled students at this centre, but it is currently going through a big crisis to the point where the future of this centre is unknown.</p> <p>Quarry Road girls' boarding school and vocational training centre teaches teenage girls a number of courses including: catering, nutrition, first aid, dress making, hair dressing and child care. It suffers greatly to try and operate on school fees, and a lot of girls drop out as they don't have support to continue.</p> <p>Financial support for either of these training centres will go towards equipment.</p>

Project 4: A classroom in a nursery school

Location	Kenya East
Amount	\$10,000
Description	<p>Kibera nursery school is not less than an Oasis in the Kibera slum, probably the second largest in the world! This place offers children a caring environment where they receive 3 meals a day, 6 days a week and basic education up to 6 years of age.</p> <p>Currently the “baby class” (3-4 year olds) is overcrowded but the officers have a dream to expand the classroom for which they require funding. Extending the classroom will open up space to take in more “babies” from the waiting list.</p>
